Purpose

- The purpose of this lesson is to identify important Classical composers and learn about the Classical orchestra.

Key Student Objectives

- Explain the purpose of the pianoforte.
- Identify the most notable Classical composers as Mozart, Beethoven, and Haydn.
- Recall that the Classical orchestra was larger than the Baroque orchestra.
- Recall that the pianoforte became popular in the Classical period.
- Recognize that Classical music featured the string quartet.
- Recognize that the Classical period (1750-1820) was characterized by order, balance, and simplicity in music, art, fashion, and architecture.
