## Verbal Behavior

Simple Description on Choosing Targets

**Tact:** comes from word, contact. Contacting the environment. It is a label or statement made about any visual item or experience.

Ex. I see a bird (when it is flying by)

Ex. It is a boy (when shown a picture of a boy)

Mand: comes from the word, command. The learner requests access or removal of an item, attention, or activity. States what they want or need

**Receptive**: This requires the learner to follow an instruction. This can be to perform a task, point to something, retrieve an item, or discontinue an activity.

Intraverbal: Answer a W question or fill in information such as words to a song or completing a statement.

Motor Imitation: Follows the instruction to "DO THIS" follows and action of teacher

A target per each component must be selected. This can used during a center time play activity, group lesson, individual activity, work time activity, or integrated throughout the day. Take probe data, a yes or no, score on the first time it is tested that day. 5 yeses in a row= mastered . Skills can be modified and broken down from single words to multiple sentence exchanges. Use NET lesson plan or current step per component to take data.
