

## **LQBTQ Crosswalk Grades 7-12**

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## **Board Approved:**

Assembly Bill A1335: This law would require that LGBT Americans, as well as Americans with disabilities, are included and recognized for their **significant historic contributions to the economic, political, and social development of New Jersey and the United States**. Specifically, this legislation would add LGBT people and individuals with disabilities to the existing list of underrepresented cultural and ethnic groups, which are covered by current law related to inclusion in textbooks and other instructional materials in schools.
