- • selecting the right shots can streamline the editing process.

- • Demonstrate the understanding of organizing and creating video sequences using i Movie in student projects
- • Demonstrate the understanding of transitions used on student projects.
- • Demonstrate understanding of editing techniques based on High Noon's 11:58 montage. The Birds playground sequence and Lawrence of Arabia's jump cut by completing a viewing guide
- • Demonstrate understanding of editing techniques through student project work. adding, moving, deleting and trimming thumbnails
- • Demonstrate understanding of editing terms and techniques in written quizzes.
- • Demonstrate understanding of work flow by creating an editing work flow chart for each project.
- • Preview the essential questions and connect to learning throughout the semester

Learning Plan

- • Familiarize students with the Apple OSX system and i Movie.
- • Prepare and present posters and complete graphic organizers on the components of i Movie..
- • Present a lesson on video and audio file types.

• • Preview the essential questions and continue to contribute to Film Production Journal that will follow students throughout the course.

- • View an instructional DVD explaining the main components of i Movie.

• View the editing techniques used in Fred Zinneman's High Noon's 11:58 montage, Alfred Hitchcock's The Birds "school yard sequence and David Lean's Lawrence of Arabia's famous "jump cut" scene.
