

09 Alcohol and Drugs

Brief Summary of Unit

The purpose of this unit is meant to educate students on the effects of alcohol and drugs on the body as well as how to lead a drug free lifestyle. Students will learn that alcohol is a drug, and that experimentation with any type of drug can lead to addiction. Emphasis will be placed on the dangers of underage drinking, harmful effects that drug use has on the growth and development of teenagers, and refusal skills for avoiding peer pressure to use drugs or alcohol.
