

05 Safe Driving Rules and Regulations

Brief Summary of Unit

This unit will emphasize the importance of following all rules and regulations of New Jersey motor vehicle laws in order to ensure safe driving. Focus will be placed on the dangers of cell phone use behind the wheel, importance of following speed control, how to safely navigate different types of roadways, and safe passing, stopping, and turning.
