

06 Defensive Driving

Brief Summary of Unit

This unit will introduce the concept of defensive driving and discuss defensive driving techniques, reiterate the dangers of cell phone use behind the wheel, and teach students how to identify and avoid dangerous and aggressive drivers on the road. In addition, students will learn techniques for utilizing a safe following distance from other vehicles, as well as to how to adapt their driving for different road conditions. Finally, the students will study how to react during various vehicle related emergencies, as well as how to remedy a variety of common car conditions.
