

07 Drinking, Drug Use, and Penalties

Brief Summary of Unit

This unit will introduce the laws surrounding alcohol and drug consumption when mixed with driving. The students will learn about the dangers of using alcohol or drugs when driving, and will be introduced to the potential consequences for driving under the influence. In addition, the class will discuss and review refusal skills for avoiding drinking and driving, as well as the role and importance of designated drivers.

Essential Questions

What senses are affected by alcohol and drugs in the bloodstream that make it dangerous to drive while under the influence?

What level of responsibility do all motorists have in preventing drunk driving accidents?

Students Will Know/ Students Will Be Skilled At

The laws surrounding alcohol use and motor vehicle operation

Any amount of alcohol in the bloodstream will affect a person's ability to safely drive

The concentration of alcohol in various common alcoholic beverages, as well as what quantity of fluid constitutes a drink of beer, wine, and liquor

The importance of designated drivers in preventing alcohol related collisions

The penalties for impaired driving

Consequences and penalties for other common driving infractions

Key terms: Blood Alcohol Concentration, speeding, weaving, slow driving, designated drivers, divided attention, tracking ability, balance, coordination, breath test, suspension, loss of license, vehicular manslaughter, implied consent, ignition interlock, point system
