Brief Summary of Unit

At the preschool level, students participate in interdisciplinary activities that promote cultural awareness, sensitivity to individual differences, and respect for diversity.

In this course, students are provided with opportunities to develop skills that pertain to a variety of careers. When completing this course, students can make informed choices and pursue electives that further their study and contribute toward the formation of career interest.

Essential Questions

- Do some people share the same culture as me?

Essential Understandings

Students Will Know

- Kindness is a part of respect
- People come from different cultures
- People come in all shapes, colors, sizes, dress, etc.

Students Will Be Skilled At

- Identifying similarities and differences amongst peers
- Playing with peers of all cultural backgrounds
- Showing respect and kindness during all aspects of the day

Evidence/Performance Tasks

This course is designed to promote skill attainment. Student progression and pace through which they proceed through the performance tasks is based on their affinity for and ability to reach skill attainment. The teacher will determine formative and summative skill attainment; alternative assessments will be incorporated for each student based on their strengths and challenges.

- Including others in play
- Singing songs from other cultures
- Sorting activities based on hair color, eye color, gender, etc.
- Utilizing cultural props, puppets, and costumes in dramatic play area

Learning Plan

- Explore costumes that are worn in other countries
- Have discussions about culture
- Invite parents in to talk about cultural differences
- Look at pictures on SMARTBoard of children from other countries
