Essential Understandings

- Respect is a fair and objective attitude toward opinions and practices that may differ from one's own and is reflected in a person's thoughts, feelings and behaviors.
- Respect is demonstrated in a variety of ways, including personal beliefs and interpersonal interactions.
- Students use acquired knowledge, attitudes and interpersonal skills to understand and respect themselves and others.
- The global community is diverse and encompasses a variety of cultures, beliefs and religions.
- There is no superior race, culture or religion.

Students Will Know

- As a ninth through twelfth grade student, I have the ability to understand implicit and explicit biases.
- Awareness of and regard for the variety of cultures, beliefs and religions within the global community helps to diminish biases.
- It is best to be considerate of others' feelings, which may mean dealing peacefully with anger, insults and disagreements.
- Respect is having due regard for the feelings, wishes, rights and/or traditions of others.
- The role of the responsible community member is to continually work to understand and celebrate the similarities and differences amongst us.

Students will be able to

- Experience multiple perspectives other than one's own through role playing.
- Identify and empathize with alternative points of view.
- Identify implicit and explicit biases.
