Essential Questions/Enduring Understandings

- What is the structure of a script?
- How do playwrights develop impactful and interesting characters?
- What is the importance of diversifying speech patterns and vocabulary within a script?
- How can unsolvable conflicts be resolved into a satisfying ending?

What happens when theatre artists use their imaginations and/or learned theatre skills while engaging in creative exploration and inquiry?

How can the same work of art communicate different messages to different people?

How do theatre artists use tools and techniques to communicate ideas and feelings?

Theatre artists' interpretations of drama/theatre work are influenced by personal experiences and aesthetics.

Theatre artists develop personal processes and skills for a performance or design.

What happens when theatre artists allow an understanding of themselves and the world to inform perceptions about theatre and the purpose of their work?

As theatre is created and experienced, personal experiences and knowledge are synthesized to interpret meaning and analyze the way in which the world may be understood.

Theatre artists allow awareness of interrelationships between self and others to inform their work.

Theatre artists make choices to convey meaning.

How do theatre artists fully prepare a performance or design?

Theatre artists work to discover different ways of communicating meaning.

Objectives

Students will know:

- how a play is formatted and structured
- how to read a script and apply dramaturgical principles to it
- the common roles found in scripts and their purposes

Students will be skilled at:

- properly formatting a script to ensure legibility to an actor and director
- writing diverse characters who speak with unique voices and perspectives

- creating and resolving conflict within a scene

Learning Plan

- Discuss formatting and structure of a script.
- Use scripts on hand to model this formatting and have students analyze them.
- Revisit earlier scripts to discuss dramaturgy and the roles of the characters.
- Use writing exercises to develop students' creativity.
- Provide guidelines such as pushing students to continue writing, subvert audience expectations, and kill your darlings.
- Provide increasingly open-ended prompts allowing for greater freedom in student writing.
- Offer individualized prompts for the final.

Assessments

- Students will receive feedback throughout the unit as they read aloud scenes.
- Students will submit one original script of their choosing they feel best demonstrates their abilities.
- Students will be assessed on the diversity of voice, the formatting, the scene structure including conflict resolution, and the depth of the characters.
- Students will write a script based on a new prompt as their final.
