

Unit 4: Using Informed Decisions to Create Modern Websites

Brief Summary of Unit

The unit will emphasize that successful web design involves more than creating an attractive website. Professional web designers must balance visual design with usability, accessibility, performance, content strategy, technical requirements, client goals, and the needs of diverse users. By the end of the unit, students will create and present a polished web project that demonstrates current design practices, thoughtful decision-making, effective collaboration, and the ability to evaluate and improve a website using professional standards.

- Students will conduct online research on current trends in web design. Research may focus on any of

the following topics:

- information architecture
 - responsive design and modern layout systems
 - cross browser and cross device testing; progressive enhancement
 - performance optimization
 - content management systems and visual site builders
- Students will bring back to the webmaster team any trends that they believe could be incorporated into the high school's website, and the team will discuss, as a whole, the merits of such incorporation.
 - Discussion on the overall way of learning about new programs and technologies.
