

Unit 04: Stage Management & Dramaturgy

Brief Summary of Unit

This unit will focus on the conceptualization of a play to its production with a focus on the roles of Stage Manager and Dramaturg. Students will be responsible for completing a production book that will include all aspects of production.

Essential Questions

- How do you analyze a play for different aspects of production?

Students Will Know

- Students will know how to analyze a play by interpreting the intent of the playwright this is to be

communicated to the audience.

- Students will know how to create and design sets, costumes, lights, sound, blocking, and stage combat and properly document them within their production book.
- Students will know what a stage manager's responsibilities are and will be skilled at implementing them during the pre-rehearsal, rehearsal, and performance processes.

Students Will Be Skilled At

- Students will be skilled at approaching all aspects of technical theatre with discipline.
- Students will be skilled at working within the context of the play to research and determine historical, cultural, and socio-economical influences.

Evidence/Performance Tasks

- Students will demonstrate through discussions, projects, and the written materials of the production book, a comprehension of design of various technical theatre elements.
- Students will demonstrate understanding of the dramaturgical process and its findings through presentation of the rehearsal packet.
- Students will provide rehearsal reports as evidence of student learning and engagement.
- Students will show mastery of technical theatre by running and calling a show.

Learning Plan

- Create a production book that will be used throughout the spring play and will cover each area of technical theatre.
- Use the internet to research the historical, cultural, and socio-economic influences of the play and playwright.
- Conceptualize and design sets, costumes, make-up lights, sounds, and stage combat documenting each in separate sections of their production book.
- Create a dramaturgical rehearsal packet with all research compiled to give to cast and crew.
- Assist director in creating French scene breakdowns, prop flow charts, rehearsal schedules, contact sheets, and other basic show documentation.

- Attend all rehearsals/performances taking notes to produce rehearsal/performance reports for the company.
- Notate all blocking in the rehearsal text of the production book.
- Notate all cues in the calling text of the production book.
- Assist in the running of performances taking a leadership role.
- Call performances as they happen.
