Brief Summary of Unit

In this unit, students will build upon previous knowledge to examine and analyze the ways in which dance exists in various forms throughout the world. Dance as entertainment, communication, cultural identity, and socio-political movements will be analyzed.

Essential Questions

- How do people use dance in their lives?
- What role does dance play in various cultures and communities?
- Why does dance persist throughout time?
- Why is dance history relevant?

Essential Understandings

- Dance is a universal language that is used in a wide variety of contexts and settings to communicate meaning
- Throughout time, dance has been an important element in all cultures and communities through celebrations, mournings and as a means of entertainment
- Learning about dance must be placed in an inquiry based context, and reflects one's own experiences, values and community

Students Will Know

- All dance forms have historical roots
- Different forms of dance exist for different reasons
- Throughout time dance has influenced and been influenced by a variety of social, cultural and political

Students Will be Skilled At

- Identifying and discussing the impetus for different forms of dance and where/when they take place
- Brainstorming about ways in which different forms of dance connect
- Relating to various forms of dance throughout time
- Referring to their own personal history to examine their community's cultural dance backgrounds

Learning Plan

- Discuss essential questions
- Through movement experiences, students will be exposed to various forms of social and culturally based dance forms
- View various forms of historically accurate dance
- Discuss and research the ways in which various dance forms existed in time alongside music, art, theater and costuming

- Discussion and journal prompts
- Ability to demonstrate short movement phrases of genre specific movement
- Pair and share
- Research specific forms in small groups and present to class
- Independence assessed by grade level
