Unit Overview

Unit 1 aims at reviewing & reinforcing the principles and elements of Graphic Design and offers a refresher on Adobe Illustrator and Photoshop. Students will practice previously learned skills and apply those skills to a variety of projects.

Expanding on the current knowledge of Illustrator which was limited to shapes, pen tool, color palettes, and type tool, students will incorporate more advanced techniques including pathfinder, blending, and the gradient mesh tool.

Expanding on the curriculum of Photoshop including layers, image adjustments, layer styles, filters, students will advance those skills to be able to create intricate color adjustments, special effects and typography styles.
