Unit Overview

This unit will entail a close reading and discussion of selected excerpts from Nick Hornby's Fever Pitch. Hornby is a famous novelist who is also a rabid supporter of the English soccer club Arsenal. The memoir explores the psychology of fandom of sports and how a fan's relationship with a favorite team can affect and mirror their own lives. Students will apply Hornby's model to a writing project of their own at the end of the unit.

Transfer

Students will be able to independently use their learning to...

- appreciate and learn from literature in memoir / autobiography genre.
- have a broader appreciation for non-American sports cultures.
- relate their own experiences to that of a skilled and humorous memoirist.
- interrogate and understand their own relationship to sports.
- articulate verbally and in writing their own relationship to their favorite team.
