Instructional Tasks/Activities

- Artists complete an SOF essay on the film
- Artists will be given a lecture on filming locations, both in the real world, and throughout the school. Instructors will review rules for filming on school grounds
- Artists will be guiding in exploring the basic functions of the film gear
- Artists will be introduced to continuity in storytelling, and in props/wardrobe. They will be given a homework assignment to find poor continuity in a film, which they will share with the class the next day
- Artists will be introduced to the roles of a production designer and set designer. They will be given examples of set design in both major film productions, and “on location” at their own school
- Artists will complete a worksheet on Freytag's Pyramid
- Artists will draw storyboards for a MP2 film
- Artists will participate in a film gear workshop, where the instructors will introduce them to various film gear in the department
- Artists will participate in an improv card game to help brainstorm ideas for a MP2 Film
- Artists will pitch ideas to the instructors for a MP2 film
- Artists will view the film Planes, Trains, and Automobiles

- Artists will write a screenplay for a MP2 Film
