Instructional Tasks/Activities

- Artist will complete Adobe Premiere study guide
- Artist will present the presentation to the class
- Artist will take Adobe Premiere skills pretest
- Artists will be given a prompt and script of an existing film and be expected to illustrate the scene shot by shot
- Artists will be introduced to Adobe Premiere skills assessment through direct instruction
- Artists will brainstorm collectively to come up with a Showcase film idea
- Artists will cast actors for their film and determine who will perform what jobs on the crew
- Artists will compare and contrast student works with one another and the original film
- Artists will create a 3-Act narrative while working with three other writers
- Artists will create a slideshow on a specified film genre
- Artists will create flash cards based components of skills test
- Artists will create their own screenplays following proper formatting procedure
- Artists will explore a director and create a presentation explaining their influence on the industry
- Artists will explore a genre and create a presentation explaining narrative and technical approaches used in the genre
- Artists will illustrate a storyboard based on the script prodced
- Artists will partake in a table read of existing scripts in order to familiarize themselves with the proper formatting
- Artists will participate in game based on flash cards they have created

- Artists will present their work to the class
- Artists will take turns in a rotation writing a story
- Artists will view the actual scene they illustrated and compare how their work relates to the original
- Artists will write a script in proper format to use in production
- Artists will write their own 1-page scripts to practice the proper format
