World Conflicts

Learning Objectives

- 1. Analyze ideological differences and other factors that contributed to the Cold War and to United States involvement in conflicts intended to contain communism, including the Korean War, the Cuban Missile Crisis, and the Vietnam War.
- 2. Analyze the impact of American governmental policies on independence movements in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean, and the Middle East.
- 3. Evaluate how the development of nuclear weapons by industrialized countries and developing countries affected international relations.
- 4. Compare and contrast American public support of the government and military during the Vietnam War with that of other conflicts.
- 5. Analyze the role that media played in bringing information to the American public and shaping public attitudes toward the Vietnam War.

Essential Skills

- 1. Compare and contrast U.S. involvement in different world conflicts and how the policies regarding those conflicts changed.
- 2. Research the major policies that led to U.S. involvement in those conflicts.
- 3. Compare and contrast how American support fluctuated throughout the years between each conflict.
- 4. Research how the media began to play a bigger role in supplying information to the public beginning with the Vietnam War.

- 5. Examine primary source documents from each of the eras studied.

- Create Google Slide presentation arguing for U.S involvement in wars not on U.S. soil versus focusing on issues at home. Artists will focus on debate skills.
