Unit Summary

The purpose of this unit is to introduce artists to various ways to prevent STIs and unwanted pregnancy. Artists will learn various

types of contraception methods and how they are used. Key points that artists will be emphasized to learn will be proper use and

efficiency of various contraceptive methods. Artists will be instructed on the pros and cons associated with various contraceptive

devices and that the only 100% safe method is practicing abstinence.

Learning Objectives

- How does assessing side effects of various contraceptives affect the choices one makes for contraception?
- What skills are needed to abstain from engaging in sexual activity?

Essential Skills

- Describe the importance of shared responsibilities for avoiding sexual activity and preventing sexual risk behaviors.
- Describe the possible negatives of practicing abstinence.
- · Explain the positives of practicing abstinence
- Identify their own moral goals/objectives
- Justify why abstinence from sex is the safest, most effective risk avoidance method of protection from STIs, including HIV, and unintended pregnancy.
- · Recognize the risks/responsibility of sexual activity
