# Sequence- Unit Titles, Summaries, and Number of weeks per unit (total = 18 semester/36 year)

### Unit 1: México (6 Weeks)

The unit theme is personal and family life in the context of a Mexican family. Students will learn vocabulary and grammar that will help them describe characteristics and social relationships involving themselves and others.

## Unit 2: Puerto Rico (5 Weeks)

The unit theme is household chores & activities, contextualized with life in the Caribbean. Students will learn vocabulary and grammar to describe the appearance & layout of homes, as well as discussing typical activities completed at home.

# Unit 3: Guatemala (5 Weeks)

The unit theme is shopping for clothes, contextualized by Mayan culture & life in Guatemala. Students will learn vocabulary and grammar that will help them identify, describe, and compare clothing, stores, and prices.

#### Unit 4: Perú (7 Weeks)

The unit theme is food & dining, contextualized by the Peruvian (gastronomic) culture. Students will learn vocabulary and grammar that will help them identify food and discuss & describe the dining experience.

# Unit 5: España (7 Weeks)

The unit theme is wellness, personal health and basic remedies, contextualized by major events in Spain. Students will learn vocabulary and grammar that will help them discuss body parts, hygiene and taking care of themselves.

#### **Unit 6: Los Estados Unidos (6 Weeks)**

The unit theme is work & free time contextualized by different regions in the U.S.A. Students will learn vocabulary and grammar that will help them discuss, describe ongoing and plan future school & work events with others.
