Rationale, Transfer Goals and Enduring Understanding

The Grade 5 Phonics and Word Study curriculum develops students' advanced decoding, encoding, spelling, vocabulary, and fluency skills needed for increasingly complex reading and writing tasks. At this stage, students move beyond basic phonics to apply sophisticated knowledge of syllable patterns, morphology, Greek and Latin roots and affixes, and word analysis strategies to read and spell unfamiliar multisyllabic words accurately. Instruction emphasizes the interconnected nature of phonics, vocabulary, fluency, and writing conventions. Students learn to use structural analysis, context clues, and reference materials to determine word meanings, monitor comprehension, and communicate effectively in writing. They strengthen reading fluency through purposeful practice with grade-level texts while applying grammar, spelling, and punctuation conventions to produce clear and coherent written work. Through systematic and explicit instruction, students develop the independence and flexibility necessary to decode unfamiliar words, expand academic vocabulary, improve reading comprehension, and communicate with precision across all content areas. These foundational literacy skills prepare students for the increased reading and writing demands of middle school and support lifelong literacy.

Transfer Goals

Students will independently use their learning to:

1. Apply phonics, syllabication, morphology, and word analysis strategies to accurately decode and encode unfamiliar multisyllabic words in a variety of reading and writing contexts.
2. Read grade-level texts fluently, accurately, and expressively to support comprehension, learning, and effective communication.
3. Monitor their own reading by using context, rereading, and self-correction strategies to improve understanding.
4. Apply knowledge of spelling patterns, grammar, punctuation, and conventions to produce clear, accurate, and effective writing.
5. Use Greek and Latin roots, affixes, word relationships, context clues, and reference materials to determine the meanings and pronunciations of unfamiliar academic and domain-specific vocabulary.
6. Transfer foundational literacy skills across all subject areas to become independent readers, writers, and learners.

Enduring Understandings

Students will understand that:

- Phonics, syllable patterns, and morphology work together to help readers decode and spell unfamiliar words accurately.
- Greek and Latin roots and affixes provide meaningful clues that help readers determine the meanings of unfamiliar academic vocabulary.
- Fluent reading—including accuracy, appropriate rate, and expression—supports comprehension and effective communication.
- Skilled readers actively monitor their understanding and use context, rereading, and self-correction

strategies when meaning breaks down.

- Understanding relationships among words, including homographs, and multiple-meaning words, strengthens vocabulary and comprehension.
- Reference materials, both print and digital, are valuable tools for determining pronunciation, spelling, word meanings, and precise language usage.
- Strong foundational literacy skills enable success in reading, writing, speaking, listening, and learning across all academic disciplines.

Essential Questions

Decoding and Word Analysis (L.RF.5.3)

 - How do prefixes, suffixes, roots, and base words help us read, spell, and understand new words?

 - How can understanding word structure improve both reading and writing?
