## CSDT Technology Integration

Activity:

Students will create a picture using line, shape and color on an online paint program. We will study the work of Piet Mondrian and others as inspiration. Students will use either Chromebooks or iPads as part of a center in a center rotation class period.

Activity:

### **Climate Change**

- Activity: Focus on simple visual elements like color, shape, line, and texture, using concrete language and activities that encourage observation, discussion, and personal connection to the artwork; this can be done by looking at pictures, discussing how the artwork makes them feel, and creating their own art pieces that reflect those emotions using various materials. Discuss the role of art in raising awareness about climate change and encouraging action
