- Activity: Exploring Diverse Artistic Representations of Climate Change:

Visual Analysis:

-Show students a variety of artworks from different regions and time periods that depict climate change issues (e.g., paintings of melting glaciers from the Arctic, photographs of polluted landscapes in industrial areas, sculptures representing rising sea levels).

-Ask students to analyze the visual elements (color, composition, symbolism) and interpret how the artists are communicating their concerns about climate change.
