The presentation will include: (1) A description of each artwork's form, method, and style. (2) A comparison of how each artwork affects the audience (3) An analysis of the artists' intentions and effectiveness in addressing climate change (4) A reflection on how the students' own experiences and understanding influenced their appreciation of the artworks
