Grade 6 In MP2- Greek Civilization?? discusses how sports grew in the colonies and the impact the African American community has on sports in the American colonies.

Grade 7 In MP2- Nationalism and Sectionalism includes Eli Whitney's invention of the cotton gin.

Grade 8 Includes the most detail in regards to the historic figure

MP2- Rights, Duties, Responsibilities of Citizens and Political Parties and Interest Groups
