Essential Questions

- How do musicians generate creative ideas?

Big Ideas

- All students will understand the role, development, and influence of the arts throughout history and across cultures.
- All students will understand that tremendous creativity goes into composing music.
- The creative ideas, concepts, and feelings that influence musicians' work emerge from a variety of courses.
- Musicians' creative choices are influenced by their expertise, context and expressive intent.
- Musicians evaluate and refine their work through openness to new ideas, persistence and the application of appropriate criteria.

Core Activities

- Identify themes in music that reflect history and culture
- Understand the history and background of the different pieces that are chosen for concerts.
- Understand what can influence composers' decisions.
- Students will improvise and compose short melodies, based on the notes and rhythms that they know.
