**American Renaissance,** also called New England Renaissance, period from the 1830s roughly until the end of the <u>American Civil War</u> in which <u>American literature</u>, in the wake of the <u>Romantic movement</u>, came of age as an <u>expression</u> of a national spirit.

The literary scene of the period was dominated by a <u>group of New England</u> writers, the "<u>Brahmins</u>," notably <u>Henry Wadsworth Longfellow</u>, <u>Oliver Wendell Holmes</u>, and <u>James Russell Lowell</u>. They were aristocrats, steeped in foreign culture, active as professors at Harvard College, and interested in creating a genteel <u>American literature</u> based on foreign <u>models</u>
