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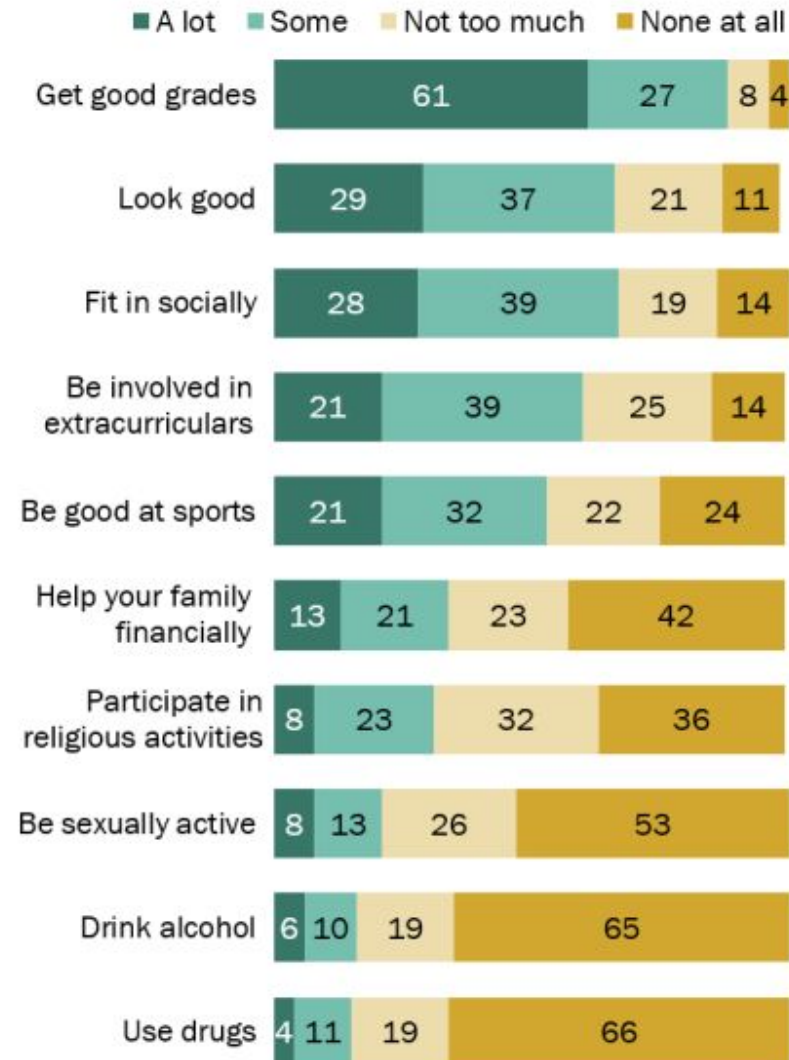
# Some Statistics.

Do you feel this is similar to pressure felt by teens today?

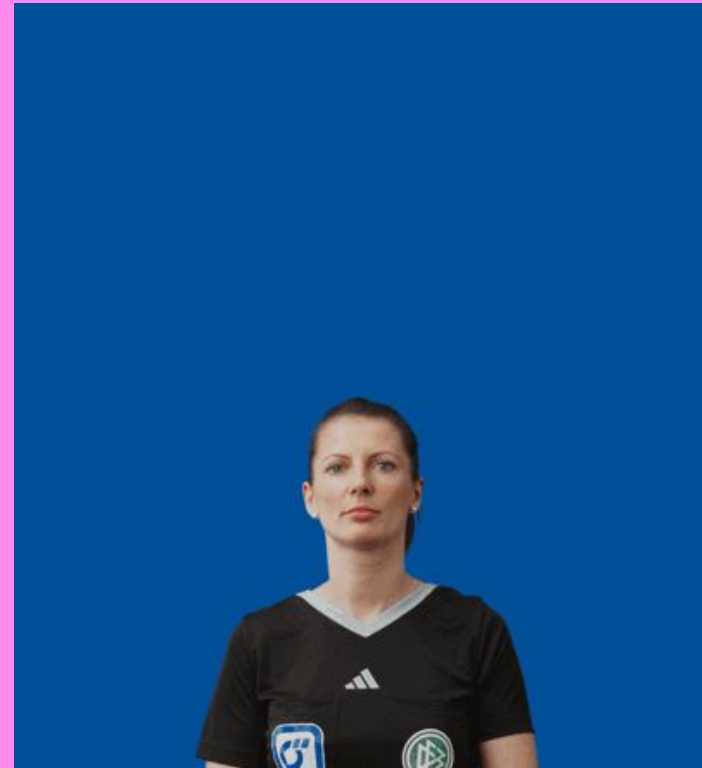
## About six-in-ten teens say they feel a lot of pressure to get good grades
