- At least two AAPI Heritage Month activities should be planned. Suggestions:

1. What does it mean to be a Pacific Islander? -

Grades 6-8 watch videos and discuss the challenges Pacific Islanders face.

Grades 3-5 watch the brainpop video on <u>Asian Pacific Islander Heritage</u> <u>video</u>

Grades K-2 watch <u>Cartoon Network Video</u>- Discuss some of the things that make their culture unique.

2. Using a map, compare Asia to the North American continent. Note that Asia isn't a single country, but rather it's a vast region covering continents, oceans, and islands of all climate types.
