## **Interpersonal**

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### 7.1.NM.IPERS.1: 7.1.NM.IPERS.5:

- In a sing along activity students will sing songs about greetings.

### 7.1.NM.IPERS.1:

- Have the students sing songs about the different members of the family and asking and responding to questions related to the relationships are mentioned in the song in target language.

### 7.1.NM.IPERS.1:

- In pairs, match pictures with the vocabulary words about pets and farm animals and label the pictures about pets and farm animals.

### 7.1.NM.IPERS.1:

- In pairs, aimed at supporting one another, students ask and respond to simple questions about their house and community such as ¿Cómo es tu casa? ¿Cuántas habitaciones tiene tu casa? ¿Qué lugares hay en tu vecindario o comunidad?

#### 7.1.NM.IPERS.4:

- Have pairs of students or small groups role play dialogue in which tell each other what their favorite month and type of weather is.  
Project the question on the board or on an anchor chart with the key vocabulary to support the students: “¿Cuál es tu mes favorito? ¿Qué tiempo hace?”

### **Presentational**

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#### 7.1.NM.PRSNT.1:7.1.NM.PRSNT.4:

- In small groups of 2-4, students will introduce oneself and others within the school settings applying the form of the reflexive verb llamar: me llamo to introduce oneself.

#### 7.1.NM.PRSNT.3:

- Have the students present to the class their family tree by explaining the relationships between their family members in target language.

#### 7.1.NM.PRSNT.1:

- In a whole group activity, define vocabulary used to talk about domestic and farm animals and present a description about pets. Use the singular and plural in the nouns and the definite article agreement with gender and number of the nouns.

#### 7.1.NM.PRSNT.4:

- Have students create a list of the vocabulary related to the rooms of the house and community places in target language.

#### 7.1.NM.PRSNT.5:

- Have students line in order according to their birthday month; then break the groups according to the season in which they celebrate their birthday. Then each group will have an opportunity to tell about their season, describe the typical weather, and report on what enjoyable activities can take place.
