Quick Quiz: Integrating information presented in different Media or form as well as in words to develop a coherent understanding of a topic or issue

Format: 4 questions, mix of multiple-choice and short response, 8–10 min max.

Directions: Answer the questions below based on the sources you have read, viewed, or listened to in class.

1. What does it mean to *synthesize* information from different sources?
 - A. To find the definition of a word in the text
 - B. To write down everything each source says word-for-word
 - C. To combine ideas from multiple sources to create a complete understanding
 - D. To focus only on one source for your answer
2. Which of the following is an example of *media*?
 - A. A short story
 - B. A poem
 - C. A podcast episode
 - D. A handwritten note
3. You watched a video about healthy eating and read an article about sugar in soft drinks. What should you do next to demonstrate understanding?
 - A. Write a summary of the video only
 - B. Compare and contrast the authors
 - C. Integrate the information to explain the impact of sugar on health
 - D. List all the soft drinks in the article
4. In your own words, explain why using multiple formats or sources helps you understand a topic better.

(Short constructed response – Suggested Answer: *Using different formats like videos, articles, and charts helps me learn more about a topic because each one gives different types of information. I can see facts, hear expert opinions, and read details which help me understand the whole picture.*)
