1. Which of the following best describes what it means to "perceive" a story in an audio version?
- A. To summarize the text
 - B. To watch the actors perform it
 - C. To understand it by listening and interpreting sounds, tone, and expression
 - D. To write down everything you hear

2. When comparing a video version to a written story, what is something you might notice in the video that isn't in the text?
- A. The vocabulary used
 - B. The author's tone
 - C. The character's emotions shown through body language and music
 - D. The number of paragraphs

3. Short Answer: Describe one difference you noticed between reading a poem and hearing it read aloud.

Student sample answer: "When I heard the poem out loud, I noticed the rhythm and emotion more than when I read it silently."

4. Short Answer: Why is it helpful to listen to or watch a version of a text after reading it?
- Student sample answer: "It helps me understand the characters' feelings better and see things I didn't notice while reading."
