<b>Score 3</b>  Mastery of complex content and concepts of learning goal	<p><b>TARGET LEARNING GOAL:</b> The student will be able to explain Marx’s theory of societal change and conflict</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discuss Marx’s conflict theory, with it’s emphasis on social change, in application to the larger society</li> <li>• Evaluate the importance that Marx places on social conflict and social change with regard to society, in comparison to the other major theorists</li> <li>• Analyze the Marx’s emphasis on the economy, his criticism of capitalism and his alternative of communism</li> <li>• Assess Marx’s argument that capitalism creates alienation within society</li> </ul> <p>Student makes no major errors or omissions regarding the score 3 content</p>
<b>Score 2</b>  Success with simpler content—vocabulary, foundational skills	<p>The student will recognize or recall specific vocabulary or basic content, such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Define key terms (class conflict, social institutions, false consciousness, communism, class consciousness, alienation, socialism etc...)</li> <li>• Review key terms/people (social conflict, bourgeoisie, proletariat, capitalists, Karl Marx, Conflict theory)</li> </ul> <p>The student will perform basic skills or process, such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recall main ideas and concepts</li> <li>• Review and utilize concepts, key words, and theories from previous units on Culture and Theory</li> <li>• Summarize each of the theories</li> <li>• Express basic skills through writing, discussion, debate, etc...</li> </ul> <p>Student makes no major errors or omissions regarding the score 2 content</p>
<b>Score 1</b> Partial success with help	With help, student achieves partial success at score 2 content and/or score 3 content
