- Third Declension Neuter and I-stem nouns of all genders
- Special cases of the Accusative/Ablative

- Nepos, "Themistocles Saves the Greeks"
- Sallus, "The Catilinarian Conspiracy"

Cultural topics will include:

- Love Poetry
- Basic Greek History up to the Persian Wars
- The Roman Senate and an introduction to Roman politics
