02 Narrative Vessel in Sgraffito

Unit Introduction

Students will produce a hand-built vessel form which tells a story on its surface. Underglazes will be introduced and used to color their pieces. They will use the ancient technique of sgraffito to carve their story into the surface of their vessels. Vessels will be bisqued fired and clear glaze will be applied and fired again. Finished products are presented for grade and are assessed using a four pronged rubric.
