Unit Introduction

Students will research the lives of prominent African-Americans. After sufficient research, students will choose one African-American to honor on a tile that will hang on the wall in room 903, the Pottery Studio. Tiles should include the person's name, the dates of their life, the reason for their prominence, and some kind of image displaying the person or their area of achievement. Pieces will be finished with glaze, underglaze or an alternative coloring method. Finished work is presented to instructor for grade, using collaboration and a four-pronged rubric. Finished pieces will be mounted on the wall in 903.
