Unit Introduction

Students will be introduced to a new tool: the extruder. Extruders push clay through a shaped die to create clay pieces of various shapes, both solid and hollow. Students will combine some extrusions with a clay vessel of their choice. Vessels can be wheel-thrown or hand-built. Their shapes will be dictated by how students wish to combine the objects. Some idea or theme should be communicated. This assignment requires careful consideration of creativity and novel thinking. However students decide to combine extruded and non-extruded pieces, they should endeavor to create something unique, personal, and communicative. The sky's the limit for this assignment. Finished student work will be graded collaboratively with the student using a four-pronged rubric.
