General Overview, Course Description or Course Philosophy

The Kindergarten Cultures and Holiday Unit is designed to provide learners with the knowledge, skills and perspective needed to understand that cultures celebrate different holidays. Students will be able to develop a class chart of celebrated holidays while comparing and contrasting holiday traditions. Lessons are aligned with the New Jersey Student Learning Standards and will infuse technology, ELA and Math within projects, activities, and written products.

OBJECTIVES, ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS, ENDURING UNDERSTANDINGS

Enduring Understandings:

- People come from different cultures.
- Some cultures have different holidays, food and clothing.

Essential Questions:

- What national holidays do we recognize and why do we celebrate these holidays?
- What are other holidays that different cultures celebrate?
- What are the similarities and differences between holidays?

- Name the different customs that families celebrate.
- Describe the different foods and clothing that support different cultures.
- Survey the holiday practices of classmates.
- Develop a visual representation of survey findings.
- Write a shared writing piece expressing a holiday that each family celebrates.
- Discuss ways to preserve the Earth.
