General Overview, Course Description or Course Philosophy

OBJECTIVES, ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS, ENDURING UNDERSTANDINGS

Objectives: The impasto method is a highly defined surface texture created with paint on canvas. Fine artists stretch their own canvas to create unique and authentic painting surfaces and sizes to accommodate their concept. Dramatic sky paintings in acrylic require painting layering techniques using gel media. Successful portrait painting requires the artist's to capture the model's essence in paint. Abstraction in art is a visual language which is derived from the artists interpretation of the original. Expressionism is a painting style which expresses meaning by the experience of the paint application by the artist.

Essential Questions: What is an art museum? How does the presenting and sharing of objects, artifacts and artworks influence and shape ideas, beliefs and experiences? How do objects, artifacts and artworks collected, preserved, or presented, cultivate appreciation and understanding?

Enduring Understandings: Acrylic Impasto, canvas, stretching, scy-scapes, independent portraiture, botanical studies, and acrylic expressionism are all essential parts of painting. Objects, artifacts and artworks collected, preserved, or presented either by artists, museums, or other venues communicate meaning and a record of social, cultural and political experiences resulting in the cultivating of appreciation and understanding.

Students will produce an authentic stretched canvas, an authentic botanical study and expressionist piece which demonstrates their implementation and mastery of the lesson objectives.
