Articulation is a system of symbols that determine the manner in which a note is performed. These symbols dictate how to enunciate music as punctuation and vocal inflexion does in spoken language.

- Like written language, how a sentence (phrase) is articulated is ESSENTIAL to conveying the appropriate musical message or character.
- The articulation terms of slur, staccato, legato, and accent all have to do with "how" the note is played

and not the length of the note.

- Tongue placement and air support help with the correct performance of articulations as notated by the composer.
