General Overview, Course Description or Course Philosophy

Do-It-Yourself (DIY) Tech is a one semester course at the high school. This class enables students to understand how to address basic household repairs while students safely use and maintain appropriate tools, machinery, equipment, and resources to accomplish project goals.

Objective:

- Students will explore their creativity in the field of interior design.

Essential Questions:

- Does each student recognize pathways available to them and the time, effort, experience and other requirements to pursue each, including a path of entrepreneurship in the interior design field?
- Will students recognize the value of each step in the education and experiential process?
- Do they recognize that nearly all career paths require ongoing education and experience?

Enduring Understandings:

- The student will be able to develop an understanding of interior design, including color selection, space planning, furniture selection and backgrounds.
