General Overview, Course Description or Course Philosophy

In Art Major 2 we foster independent and creative thought, emphasizing art-making as not only a means of personal self-expression, but a way of thinking about our relationship to culture, humanity and the world of ideas.

OBJECTIVES, ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS, ENDURING UNDERSTANDINGS

Unit Importance:

- It is important to understand that specific media requires a unique skill set for its use and application. One can combine media and techniques, as in drawing, while two or more mediums combined in one artwork is called mixed media. Mastering different mediums requires knowledge, exploration and practice of media.

Essential Question(s):

- What conditions, attitudes and behaviors support creativity and innovative thinking?
- What factors prevent or encourage people to take creative risks?
- How does collaboration expand the creative process?
- Why do artists follow or break from established traditions?
- How do artists determine what resources and criteria are needed to formulate artistic investigations?

Enduring Understanding(s):

- Artists and other presenters consider various techniques, methods, venues, and criteria when analyzing, selecting and curating objects, artifacts and artworks for preservation and presentation.
- Creativity and innovative thinking are essential life skills that can be developed.
