## Unit Overview

The students will follow and plan strategies to make positive choices and decisions to prevent conflicts. They will practice steps for effective conflict resolutions.

## Enduring Understandings

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The meaning of conflict is defining what the problem is between individuals.

The student needs to identify the conflict and plan strategies to resolve it.

Students must be able to describe and demonstrate strategies to prevent, reduce, or mediate conflict.
