Lessons/Learning Scenarios

Show pictures of American symbols. Show pictures on flipchart pg. 15 and discuss their meaning.

Students will cut out red, white, and blue pictures from magazines to create a patriotic collage.

Play historical figure/ American symbol matching game on flip chart page 16. When students make a match they have to try to recall why the person or thing is important to America.

Read big book "The Pledge of Allegiance." Discuss why we say it and what it means.
