Lessons/Learning Scenarios

Students were are given a blank New Jersey map to collage with their families. Students then discussed items that were put on the state and why they chose to include them.

A guest speaker gave a series of presentations on New Jersey related topics. The topics covered were Native American Tribes of NJ, Washington's Crossing and colonial New Jersey, Batsto and Weymoth Furnace, and local farming.

A video presentation provided by Ocean Spray exposed the students to wet and dry harvesting of cranberries.

A food tasting of local crops and iconic food.

Symbols of New Jersey were discussed through various state stories. Students then created a symbols of New Jersey book during writer's workshop.

Various projects were done throughout the month during center time.
