Last Name, First Name of Author, Title of Book, City Published in: Publisher, Copyright Date.

## ☐ Book with 2 Authors:

Last Name, First Name of Author, and First Name Last Name of second author. Title of Book. City Published in: Publisher, Copyright Date.

#### for example:

Weidenborner, Stephen, and Domenick Caruso. <u>Writing Research Papers</u>. New York: St. Martins Press, 1986.

#### **□** Book with 3 or more Authors:

Last Name, First Name of Author, et al. <u>Title of Book</u>. City Published in: Publisher, Copyright Date.

#### for example:

Kendal, Melissa, et al. <u>The Amber Wars and the Development of Europe</u>. New York: Shirlington, 1984.

## ☐ Print Encyclopedia:

Last Name, First Name of Author. "Title of Article." <u>Title of Encyclopedia</u>. City Published in: Publisher, Date of Edition.

#### for example:

Squyres, Steven W. "Mars." World Book Encyclopedia. Chicago: World Book Inc., 2003.

## **■** Electronic Encyclopedia: (World Book Online, Wikipedia)

Last Name, First Name of Author. "Title of Article." <u>Name of Encyclopedia</u>. Year of edition. Date of Access. <URL of home page>.

## **□** Magazine/Professional Journal:

Last Name, First Name of Author. "Title of Article." <u>Name of Magazine</u> Day Month Year: page numbers.

#### for example:

Wilson, Edward O. "Army Ants on the March." National Geographic Oct. 2006: 136.

#### Mewspaper:

Last Name, First Name of Author. "Title of Article." <u>Name of Newspaper</u> Day Month Year, Section and Page number.

Last Name, First Name of Author. "Title of Article." <u>Name of Publication</u>. Date of Publication: page numbers. <u>Name of Database</u>. Name of Service. Library Name, City, State, Date of Access <URL>.

## ■ Web Site:

Last Name, First Name of Author. <u>Title of Site</u>. Date of last revision. Name of organization. Day Month Year of access <URL>.

#### for example:

<u>Afghanistan</u>. 1 Nov. 2005. Central Intelligence Agency. 18 Nov. 2005. <a href="http://www.odci.gov/cia/publications/factbook/">http://www.odci.gov/cia/publications/factbook/</a>>.

#### **□** Interview:

Last Name, First Name of person being interviewed. Kind of interview. Day Month Year of Interview.

#### for example:

Washington, Denzel. Personal Interview. 5 Oct. 2005.

## Image (Online):

Artist's (if one) last name, first name. "Description Or Title Of Image." Date of image.

Online image. Title of larger site. Date of download. <URL>.

#### for example:

Smith, Greg. "Rhesus Monkeys in the Zoo." Online image. Monkey Picture Gallery. 3 May 2003 <a href="http://monkeys.online.org/rhesus.jpg">http://monkeys.online.org/rhesus.jpg</a>.

## e-Book: (Gale Virtual Reference Library)

"Title of Article." <u>Title of Book</u>. Editors name. Vol. #. Place of Book Publication: Publisher of Book, Book Copyright Date. Page numbers. Company providing online access. Library Name, City, State, Date of Access <URL>.

#### for example:

"Robotics." <u>UXL Encyclopedia of Science</u>. Ed. Rob Nagel. Vol. 9. Detroit: UXL, 2002. 1690-1692. Gale Virtual Reference Library. Gale. Jane Mears Middle School Library, Anchorage, AK. 15 January 2008 <a href="http://galenet.Galegroup.com">http://galenet.Galegroup.com</a>.

A **Bibliography** or **Works Cited** page lists alphabetically, the resources you have used. It is important that you follow these guidelines carefully. See the example below.

- ⊕Title is Works Cited.
- ⊕ Center the title.
- Abbreviate months except May, June, and July.
- Choose a simple font such as Arial or Courier.
- Alphabetize ALL entries by the first word.
- The second line of each entry must be indented ½ inch creating a hanging indent.
