Module Overview

This phonics module is designed to strengthen foundational literacy skills through an integrated approach that includes phonological awareness, phonics, spelling, handwriting, and fluency. Students develop an understanding of syllable types, including closed syllables, closed syllable exceptions, and open syllables, while applying these concepts to spelling activities. Handwriting practice focuses on forming manuscript letters such as m, t, d, c, a, i, f, l, s, e, o, u, h, n, g, w, p, and b, ensuring accuracy and legibility. Students also learn to read and spell irregular words such as put, push, or, for, was, and you. Fluency development is embedded throughout, emphasizing accuracy, self-correction, reading rate, automaticity, and expression. This comprehensive module helps students build the essential skills needed for confident and fluent reading.
