Module Overview

The world is more connected today than it has ever been. As a result, children are exposed to a diverse cultural landscape. Understanding and learning from different people and cultures is important in accepting and appreciating this diversity. In this module, children will read texts about a variety of cultures. They will also explore how their own heritage has contributed to the American culture we all share. After reading the module's texts, children should have a greater appreciation of and interest in the different people and cultures in the world around them.

Accommodations/Modifications

- Assign fewer problems at one time (e.g., assign only odds or evens)
- Clarify test directions, read test questions
- Differentiated center-based small group instruction
- Enrichment projects
- Extra time on assessments
- Highlight key directions
- If a manipulative is used during instruction, allow its use on a test
- Opportunities for cooperative partner work
- Preferential seating
- Provide reteach pages if necessary
- Provide several ways to solve a problem if possible
- Provide visual aids and anchor charts
- Test in alternative site
- Tiered lessons and assignments
- Use of a graphic organizer
- Use of concrete materials and objects (manipulatives)
