Mission Statement

Unit/Module Overview

This writing module guides students through the process of crafting a personal narrative, beginning with an exploration of a focal text that models the form and structure of narrative writing. Students engage with the text through previewing, reading, and vocabulary development, then begin prewriting by understanding the prompt and identifying a meaningful topic. During this phase, grammar lessons review foundational concepts such as nouns, action verbs, sentence types, and simple sentence structure, helping students prepare clear and effective narrative sentences.

As students move into drafting and revising, they focus on the essential elements of a personal narrative, including descriptive details, sequence of events, and personal voice. Peer conferencing provides opportunities for feedback, while grammar instruction reinforces important skills like using plural and proper nouns, accurate spelling, and recognizing compound subjects and predicates. In the final stage, students edit for run-on sentences and punctuation, proofread with peers, and publish a polished personal narrative. The module concludes with students sharing their stories, celebrating growth in both expressive writing and grammar mastery.
